1st Semester Book Report

Directions: Students are to read a work of fiction: 8th grade level or higher (Sorry, no Dr. Seuss). Then, students will complete five accompanying assignments for a total of 50 points. The book needs to be at least 150 pages in length. (I will approve some books that are less than this page length...see me if you're unsure.)

Assignment #1 (10 points) Due Oct. 30
Write an 11 sentence paragraph summary of the book. The paragraph should follow the format of 3 main events with two supporting details each complete with an introduction and a conclusion. Then, he/she will write another 8-11 sentence paragraph explaining his/her opinion of the book. Did you like it or not? Why or why not? Be specific.

Example #1:

I didn't like this book because it was stupid. I don't think anyone should read this.

Example #2:

I thought Robert Cormier wrote an interesting book even though it did have some flaws. I Am the Cheese was a great book because it was very descriptive. I really enjoyed the way the author used imagery to help me see every aspect of the story in my mind. I didn't really enjoy how long the chapters were. I would have liked it better if the author has kept the chapters shorter. I think it would have made my want to keep read. Overall, I like the details in the book, but would have preferred shorter chapters.

Assignment #2 (5 points) Due Dec. 4

Complete a full plot map with at least an exposition, rising action, conflict, climax, falling action, and resolution. Include as many details as possible.

Dec. 4 Assignment #3 (15 points) **Dua**

Re-write the ending of the novel in 3-5 pages. Be as creative as possible using vivid sensory imagery whenever possible.

Assignment #4 (points) Due Dec. 4

Fill out character description for all the characters in the novel. Include appearance, personality traits, relationships, etc. (at least 2 complete sentences for each character)

Assignment #5 (points) Due Dec. 4

Create a vocabulary list of words from the book (at least 10 total). Include in the list the word, part of speech, definition, sentence with the word from the book, and your own original sentence using the word.
